



CSJ SUMMER STUDENT POSITIONS

The Abilities Centre's goal is to offer our summer students the best possible experience, competitive hourly pay and a contract duration that will accommodate the needs of both parties (employee and employer) during the summer season.

Major funding for our summer employment positions is provided by the Government of Canada. As a result, each Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ) summer position start and end date could be subject to change, and fulfillment is pending funding approval. We will receive confirmation of the exact duration of your CSJ summer employment at the beginning of May, at which time we will promptly update all applicants.

CSJ Eligibility Criteria

We ask that you please be mindful of the following 3 questions below to ensure you will successfully pass the application process.

- If you answer NO to any of these questions we will unfortunately not be able to process your application.
- If you answer YES to all questions below and apply but do not receive our automated confirmation email recognizing your application has been successfully submitted, please contact Arnetia Findlay – Human Resources Coordinator at careers@abilitiescentre.org

Eligibility Questions:

1. Are you between 15 and 30 years of age (inclusive) at the start of employment (May/June 2022)?
2. Are you a Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* for the duration of the employment*?
3. Do you have a valid Social Insurance Number (SIN) and are you legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial / territorial legislation and regulations?

**International students are not eligible. International students include anyone who is temporarily in Canada for studies and who is not a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person who has been granted refugee status in Canada. Youth awaiting a refugee status ruling, as well as those who hold a temporary visitor visa, youth visa or work visa are ineligible. As the objective of the Canada Summer Jobs program is to support youth entering the Canadian labour market, the temporary nature of an international student's time in Canada does not allow for a long-term connection to the labour market.*

Important Note for Applicants

To ensure fairness amongst all applicants, Human Resources will only contact applicants regarding next steps after the given deadline provided on the job posting.
